COA annual voting of member offices took place. Panny is chair. Alice is vice-chair. Shirley is treasurer. Tom is secretary.

Kudos to last week's bus trip, with 27 attendees. General Shirley kept everything running smoothly. However, the bus air conditioning failure on the return drive was a serious problem. The Christmas overnight trip is filling up nicely. Note: all trip participants must be vaccinated. Another trip will be planned for the spring.

Outreach report: Masks are not required at the Senior Center, but that policy is reviewed constantly as circumstances change. Revisiting the Bolton Buzz logo for the newsletter, the decision was quickly made to proceed, get an official drawing, and permissions. Art classes have been moved back to the Senior Center on Thursdays. On the 28<sup>th</sup> is a special "smart phone basics" class. A discussion on expanding BINGO, back at the Center, centered around Heather's Outreach notes. Flu shot clinic will be held soon. Attendance at the Center is picking up. Looking for an additional Van driver. The Van pilot program is progressing very slowly. Software is clumsy and requires double entries in old and new systems.

Last year the Thanksgiving drive-thru meal was a huge success, with 120 meals distributed. It was a "Giant Hug" to Bolton seniors in the pandemic. We will try to repeat it again this year. The Senior Holiday luncheon will return this year in early December. Planning is in progress. Lisa suggested that we look into getting a postage machine for the Senior Center since mailings have increased so much because of the pandemic, and will most likely continue.




