Heather's Outreach report: Fuel assistance application has changed, see handout. The new MART software is being used exclusively now, but it's not totally accurate so the numbers aren't complete. Heather and Lisa manned the Senior handout table alone at the halloween parade: perhaps some COA members should help next year? Honey handout volunteers needed. Budget level funded + 10% inflation for next year. State grant should go up. Need new programs: perhaps Bolton history presentation? A survey in the annual census? Come up with questions. Perhaps technology help program / team; "save your seniors". Perhaps some museum trips, since other trips can be expensive. Our goal is to expand our client base: get youngsters.

Director's report: Q ride MART software is used exclusively. Kudos to Heather for a year of hard work. Reports are not there yet. A pilot, "Go Bolton" is funded so Clinton Livery can be used when MART isn't available. Billing goes thru Sudbury.

Some Goals to consider: 1. Mental health post Covid, fitness, medications. 2. Technology. 3. Market the Senior Center: get new ideas, work with other town departments, groups. Homework: write up some survey questions.

Town of Bolton Fuel Assistance Program Low-income Heat Assistance Guidelines

1. Eligibility

This fund has been established to provide fuel assistance to low-income Bolton Seniors.

Applicant must provide documentation of income earnings in order to be eligible to participate in this program. Income shall include all sources, such as pensions, interest from savings accounts, IRA's, stocks, bonds, etc.

Applicants must also first apply to the New England Farm Workers Council, Fuel Assistance program. A copy of the approval from NEFWC must be submitted with this application. (If you need help applying, please reach out.)

Extraordinary circumstance will be considered.

2. Application Process

All required information must be included with the application. Application will be accepted from November 1, 2021-March 31, 2022.

All information received will be held in the strictest confidence.

3. Distribution of Funds

Funds will be distributed on a regular basis. The funds that are granted to applicants will be paid directly to the fuel provider.
