Money is a big issue, and many have no one else to talk to. Bolton is considering getting a part time social worker using Covid dollars, which would be very good. Heather and Lisa have a very great rapport with town hall.

Covid tests should be in every household: perhaps buy some to have on hand. Testing is done at the old Sears garage at the Solomon Pond Mall. Wear masks, sanitize hands, change out mask every two hours because they loose effectiveness when wet.
