Public Ways Safety Committee Minutes

Bolton, Massachusetts Zoom Meeting August 11, 2020

Members present via Zoom: Mary Ciummo, Michael Keller, and Holly Lauer. Leslie Breeze logged on but was unable to participate because of technical difficulties. Guest: Bolton resident Joshua Etzey

The meeting was called to order at 7:06 PM.

The minutes of March 11, 2020 were reviewed and approved.

Resident concern: Josh Etzey spoke of traffic concerns in the area of Wattaquadock and Main Streets. He was pleased to see the additions and improvement to sidewalks in the area, but had safety concerns over speed limits on Main Street and truck use of Wattaquadock. He relayed an incident where gridlock was created from a truck turning at the intersection requiring police involvement to get traffic moving again. He also mentioned there being approximately 14 children that will be walking to Florence Sawyer School from the neighborhood. His safety concerns for the kids lead him to questions about speed limits. The committee expressed that we actively support and are pursuing both a reduced speed in the center of town and a truck exclusion for Wattaquadock Hill Road. Mr. Etzey may write to Representative Kate Hogan about his concerns in the hopes that she can help bring the issue up at the state level.
