

# Take a Walk on the Wild Side

from  
Northwoods to Zink

**Event Date:** Friday, March 22<sup>nd</sup> 2019

**Time:** 10:00am

**Duration:** ~2 hours



**Parking:** near the Northwoods Trailhead along the shoulder of Ledgewood Circle, *Warning the verges are likely to be muddy. Please try not to ruin them with car tracks.*

Ledgewood Circle is off the Drumlin Hill development which can be accessed from Harvard Road via Warner Road.

**Weather Policy:** We will plan to hold the event if sustained rain is light. The rain date option will be used if sustained rain is moderate to heavy, or in the event of thunder, lightning, and/or strong wind.

**Recommended Gear:** Participants should dress appropriately. We encourage participants to bring water. Dogs are welcome if under direct control of owner; ON LEASH for the walk please. No umbrellas please. Maps are available from the Conservation Agent.

**\*as a reminder due to the significant precipitation, many of the trails throughout town are wet, please wear appropriate footwear. Walking poles and mini spikes could be useful\***

We will be descending at the start of the hike, so the uphill part will be on the return.

Join Bolton Trails Committee on a two-hour ramble through [Zink Northwoods](#), to explore the Conservation Area and trails.

This trail descends through upland habitat past several boulders to a lovely stream with a number of crossings.

There has been a lot of precipitation and snow melt resulting in high water in the stream at the lower end of the trail. The stepping stone crossing is therefore rather difficult. So we will follow the route from the higher ground as far as possible and return the way we came. We may also encounter deer and other wildlife!

Celebrate World Water Day by exploring our conservation property and end March on the right foot by walking the wilderness of Bolton!
