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² Policy, SOP or Guideline #88-10 (Effective Date 1-28-89), the Department's "Daily Consumption Per Person" policy, calls for using a standard of 100 gallons per day per person when estimating consumption for a non-metered water system. The greatest number of residential customers a private water system can serve is 24, which would result in an estimate of 2,400 gallons per day of water use. Using the method for calculating a Zone I radius defined in the Regulation, a pumping rate of 2,400 gallons per day would result in a Zone I radius of approximately 160 feet.
